Accessible Will Writing

The presentation will explore the journey from identifying the problem to creating the solution, highlighting how this partnership is transforming access and ensuring deaf people's voices are fully heard when planning for the future.

Key Facts:

- **Everyone Deserves a Voice** – Too many deaf people have missed out on free will writing schemes simply because they weren't offered in British Sign Language (BSL). All legal advisers can play a part in helping change that.
- **Breaking Down Barriers** – Through BDA's partnership with Culver's Law, deaf people can now access expert will writing services in their own language – making the process clear, simple, and stress-free.
- **Inclusion Changes Lives** – This initiative is about more than writing wills; it's about equality, empowerment, and ensuring deaf people are never left behind when planning for their future – including the charitable gifts they wish to leave to the causes they care about.
